FROM THE PRESIDENT DONNA H.

On Thursday evening, February 18th, I experienced a feeling of satisfaction as our club participated in a GWI information night. It really was an open sharing session. Before the meeting, I asked two

members our club to represent opposing perspectives regarding the GWI vote. Both speakers did their homework and gave us interesting information to think about.

Some of the information discussed at the session is being included in the newsletter. I hope each member will read all this information as well as that sent out previously before you make your voting decision.

Your Board of Directors will be meeting on Feb. 25th to finalize the voting details. Within approximately a week, you will receive an email with instructions on how to proceed with the vote.

You can vote only once. The voting link we will be using is called Survey Monkey. We have created a confidential free account with a username and password. Two members of the Board can access the account. When you click on the link, the Vote/Survey will appear immediately. Enter your first and last name (we have to know who has voted) answer the question(s) and click on *submit*. If you have any issues at all, i.e., you are unable to enter data, we can then send you a ballot via email. Please call if you do not have email available. A ballot can be delivered to your home and picked up or mailed if required.

CFUW National decided to move forward with this voting process because they were advised by their lawyers that the CFUW National Executive has the responsibility to ensure the financial viability of the organization under the new NOT for Profit Legislation Guidelines. It is not about taking sides. CFUW National will still be a member of GWI. All CFUW clubs across Canada are independent and are now free to make their own decision regarding membership in GWI.

Our voting decision will affect us for the year 2022. Whatever CFUW Oshawa and District votes for, OPT IN or OPT OUT, can also be reversed a year later, if our membership presents a motion and it passes. Nothing is carved in stone.

So, in summary, with freedom comes responsibility. Let's have an excellent voter response. Call or email Donna if you need assistance. $\mathcal{D}owna\mathcal{H}$.

Two member views of the GWI (Graduate Women International) question:



A) The Opt In Opinion

Note – it is our **club** that currently is a member of GWI (not individual people). Similarly, it is CFUW National that is a member of GWI. CFUW National has committed to remain a member of GWI but possibly with fewer membership numbers and therefore decreased financial support.

GWI has goals that are shared with both our national and our individual clubs:

- To promote education for women and girls around the world
- To promote international cooperation around issues affecting women and girls
- To advocate for the advancement of human rights status for women and girls.

GWI has a robust website that describes the work it does internationally. These are some of the main projects and/or tasks:

- Advocates for women's rights by regularly engaging with a wide variety of international organizations (50+) such as the World Health Organization, the UN, UNICEF, etc.
- Annually awards fellowships and research grants to women in a variety of countries.
- Chooses several projects a year with which to work directly e.g., this year, *Teachers for Rural Futures*, teenage girls completing their education in Uganda, microgrants for women starting small businesses, and grants for women displaced by war.
- Works with regional groups to support the exchange information, organize conferences and webinars, publish newsletters, etc.

Approximately 6000 women and girls globally have been positively impacted by GWI projects since 2015. Now more than ever, help is needed around the world because of the projected challenges caused by the pandemic. The UN estimates that COVID-19 19 will push 47 million additional women below the poverty line.

In 2016, GWI was near insolvency but has been working since to strengthen their financial accountability. Their success so far is in the Triennial Report 2019 available on-line. In Canada we are in a privileged position compared to many women around the world. Membership in GWI provides support for their work to support women and girls. We are being asked to weigh this against the financial challenges of CFUW National and the financial requirements of our local club.



B) The Opt Out Opinion

Basically, many of the same CFUW goals can be accomplished without GWI; opting out will not affect our focus on local needs and activities, and it might also reduce our annual membership costs.

National CFUW Advocacy for women and girls will continue:

- 1. CFUW National will continue to work at the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women
- 2. CFUW National will continue to advocate for women and girls through IAW (International Alliance of Women)
- 3. Our club has sponsored International projects with and without National CFUW projects.
- 4. The work that our CFUW National committees do within Canada advocating for women and girls at federal government committees is active and praiseworthy. There are reports available summarizing their efforts. The results of their work may not be seen at the local level, but it is encouraging to see the National office doing what we cannot do locally but support wholeheartedly.

Financial challenge may be mitigated somewhat by removing the GWI dues.

- 1. Our club membership is shrinking which means the per capita cost of renting a venue increases.
- 2. The search for cost effective venues for meetings is a very difficult task. Over the past years, ad hoc committees have been tasked to find a meeting place; the availability of locations with parking, kitchen, appropriate room size, seating setup and takedown, while being financially feasible, presents a challenge. Thus far, Kingsview is a good location, and it might be possible to negotiate a little more flexibility in the cost given that there are a couple of club members who belong to the congregation.

Withdrawal from GWI will not stop our support of local projects for women and girls and related charities.

- 1. Our club will continue to donate at the local level to the college, the university, to other organizations such as The Refuge, Luke's Place, and Herizon House.
- 2. In the same way, our club members will still be able to support charitable projects at a national level, or international level, by contributing as individuals. Some international projects may not be specifically for females, but the work that the many Canadian and international charities do will ultimately benefit women and girls as well as the communities where the organizations work.

Opting out will not be the end of GWI, but it will end the discussion that has paralyzed CFUW at the national level.


